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### **NHSE HAVE A PLAN TO IMPROVE NATIONAL AUDITS**

Dawn Chamberlain gave a passionate speech that mainly focused on how NHS England want to improve NCAs. The promises include: faster reporting of national data to stakeholders, less data burden and a broadening of the national programme.
