The Competition Roadmap

Stage 1 Nomination process

In September and October we invited nominations for our Local Clinical Auditor of the Year. Nominations could be made for anyone working in local clinical audit (as long as they did not hold a paid national role). Nominators were simply asked to write up to 300 words on the person they wanted to nominate and send this to the Clinical Audit Support Centre. The deadline for nominations was 29 October 2021.

Stage 2 Shortlisting finalists

A total of 38 nominations were received and these were assessed by the CASC Directors. 4 nominations were received for clinical audit teams and these were discounted from the analysis. In total the CASC Directors shortlisted a total of eight finalists.

Stage 3 Announcing Finalists

All nominators were informed of the outcome of the selection process via email at the start of week commencing 8 November. The CASC team created short biographies for all eight finalists and these were shared on Twitter across 5 days from 8 November to 12 November. All finalists kindly shared relevant photos and checked key information.

Stage 4 Voting for winners

Voting for the winners will take place during what is Local Clinical Audit Awareness Week 2021. There will be two awards on offer. The Local Clinical Auditor of the Year Award will be a Twitter vote held over 3 days commencing on 23 November with the winner revealed as part of the annual Healthcare Conferences UK Clinical Audit Leadership Conference on 26 November. The Twitter vote will include two semi-finals and final featuring four finalists. In addition, Martin Ferris will be selecting his winner for the Martin Ferris Local Clinical Auditor of the Year Award.

Stage 5 Announcing winners

The winners will be announced during the Healthcare Conferences UK Clinical Audit Leadership Conference on 26 November. Details will also be posted on the Clinical Audit Support Centre Twitter @cascleicester and placed on the CASC website. The Twitter results will be publicly available for all to see and Martin Ferris will supply information on why he selected his winner. All finalists will be offered a free place at the HCUK conference courtesy of CASC.
