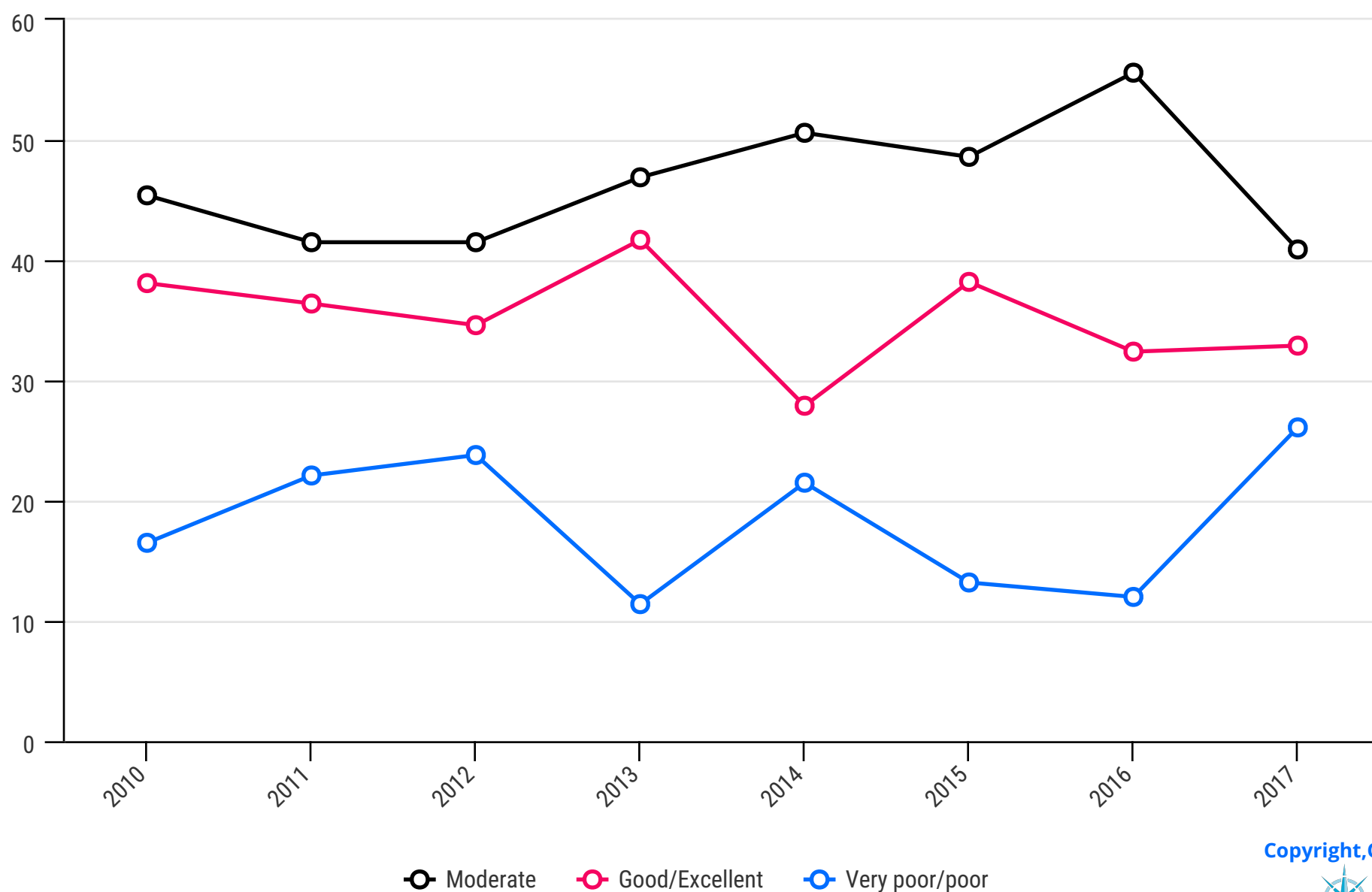


Rating national clinical audits

What does data from the CASC annual survey tell us?



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Background

The data above is derived from the question: 'Overall, how would you rate the quality of national clinical audit projects that you have taken part in?' From 2010 to 2017 over 100 surveys have been returned each year with a record high of 218 in 2016 (n=175 in 2017). The majority of respondents to the survey are clinical audit professionals working in the acute sector.



SSNAP

Over 8 years of running the survey the Stroke National Audit has always been voted the 'most effective' national clinical audit by a clear margin each year.



Psychosis

In 2017 the National Audit of Psychosis received the most nominations in the 'least effective' NCA. 27 nominations were the highest since the survey commenced.



Reinvigoration

In 2006 Sir Liam Donaldson set down a challenge that national audit needed to be reinvigorated. In 2017, just 17% of respondents stated that national clinical audit has been reinvigorated.
